



MINUTES OF LEGISLATIVE AND ORDINANCE COMMITTEE MEETING
59 COURT ST, WESTFIELD, MA
COUNCIL CHAMBERS
MARCH 29, 2022 at 5:30 PM

The meeting was called to order by Councilor Figy at 5:30 PM.

Councilor Figy called the Roll. The following committee members were present: Chair, Ralph Figy, James Adams and Michael Burns.

Upon Motion of Councilor Adams, it was
VOTED: That the L&O Minutes of the February 10, 2022 meeting be accepted.
Motion seconded by Councilor Burns.
Approved by Roll Call 3-0

Councilor Figy opened the meeting for public participation.

Under "Public Participation" the Councilors were addressed by Chairwoman of Friends of Columbia Greenway Rail Trail Carmel Steger, 60 Wood Road, She introduced Chair of Development Jonathan McHatton, 42 Arnold Street. Mr. McHatton spoke in favor of Complete Streets. He stated residents and visitors deserve safe and accessible streets to travel. Having Complete Street policies will enable the City to pursue additional funds to repair these streets for everyone.

Under "Public Participation" the Councilors were addressed by Jessica Britton, 36 Casimir Street. She spoke in opposition of Complete Streets stating it is tighter government control and takes away our local controls and powers, which is dangerous. She believed the Council shouldn't pass this just to receive money from the State.

Under "Public Participation" the Councilors were addressed by At-Large City Councilor Dan Allie, 38 Union Street. He stated his concerns with the Complete Streets program. In 2016 City Council rejected Complete Streets because it takes away local control, adds costs and unfunded mandates to all projects both public and private based upon principles rather than the needs of Community on a project by project basis. He believes agreeing to these principles puts mandates on our City Staff and Boards and Commission members as well as obligates the City to future demands that are determined by the state. He warned the committee about associated costs the City would incur as well as the State's ability to reverse the option to opt out.

Under "Public Participation" the Councilors were addressed by Maryann Babinski, 114 Rogers Ave. She was on the Council in 2016, she was in favor of it then and spoke in favor of it now. She hopes it doesn't get written off because it was voted down then. She hopes the Council will separate fact and fiction. She believes Complete Streets provides residents access to multi modal paths, safe travels and protects their health and welfare. Westfield is at the Tier 1 stage. South Hadley had signed on to this when it was first before the Council. Since then almost 500 communities in the state are in the final stages. She suggested reaching out to them to learn from their experiences and gain insight on their views of Complete Streets.

Under "Public Participation" the Councilors were addressed by Gabriella Michaliszyn, 304 Sackett Road. She informed the committee that in Ward 4, there is a failed Culvert and Fowler Road is being washed out. Westfield has 250 miles of road that there isn't funding for. She stated it was unreasonable to add requirements for upgrades or reconstruction until we can repair the roads we have. Complete Streets causes the City to add to projects when it doesn't necessarily make sense. She questioned why the City would commit to this rather than make choices whether or not to add bike paths.

Under "Public Participation" the Councilors were addressed by Ward 3 City Councilor Bridget Matthews-Kane, 81 Court Street. She spoke in favor of agenda items 7 and 9 along with Complete Streets. Complete Streets was designed to ensure streets are safe for people walking, biking, using wheelchairs and public transit. People in opposition believe the City will be tied but there is the option to opt out. A reason that was not discussed last time this was before the Council, is the 424 accidents that have occurred over the last 20 years to bicyclists and pedestrians in the Westfield Community. She submitted a list of the crash data from the Mass Department of Transportation to the Committee Chair (Appendix A) and informed the committee that most of the accidents happen in Wards 2 and 3. She referenced the changes recently made on Western Ave as an example of what Complete Streets would look like. In front of Stanley Park islands have been put in the middle to make for easier crossing. Pedestrian activation crossing lights have been installed that blink to alert cars that someone is crossing. The road is slightly wider and bike paths have been added.

Under "Public Participation" the Councilors were addressed by At-Large City Councilor Dan Allie, 38 Union Street. He noted that it took residents of Westfield, fighting with the State, to remove the bike lane from the middle of Western Ave to the outside of the road. They're putting lanes in the middle of the road where they don't belong. He has witnessed kids get hit by using middle lane bike paths.

6. Upon motion of Councilor Adams, it was VOTED: That the City NOT EXERCISE ITS FIRST RIGHT OF REFUSAL on the Notice of Intent submitted by Attorney Brad Moir for Helen A. Allen (deceased), Linda A. Vaughn and Jeffrey R. Allen, Trustees of the Robert S. Allen Funding Trust to convert land to other use pursuant to MGL 61A Section 14 for land on North Road into Residential use.

Prior to the vote, Councilor Figy welcomed Attorney Brad Moir. He referenced exhibit 1 on the application (Appendix B), the rest of lot 2 and lot 1 are currently under 61A. They want to convert this, to eventually sell the house. This is the house and the back land that we wish to convert to residential. The City has the first right of refusal and option to purchase, and we're asking you to waive that. Councilor Figy informed the committee, the Conservation Commission had initial interest but is no longer wishing to pursue First Right of Refusal. Attorney Moir stated he believed initially they were interested because they thought it was the 90 acres of land across the street. Councilor Figy confirmed and informed Attorney Moir that the City Council would be meeting on April 7th. Councilor Adams asked for clarification on which lots were being proposed. Attorney Moir stated that Lot 2 on exhibit 1 and lot 1 in the back. He stated the back land needed to go with the house. Councilor Adams asked if it would remain as one lot and Attorney Moir confirmed that it would be sold as one piece.

7. Upon motion of Councilor Adams, it was VOTED: to SUBMIT an Order establishing a revolving account entitled "Off Street Parking Lot Maintenance Costs Account" replacing a previously adopted order with a POSITIVE RECOMMENDATION.

Prior to the vote, Councilor Matthews-Kane, Off-Street Parking liaison, informed the committee that Off-Street has a large pool of money for lot maintenance but currently has restrictions on what they can purchase. They've had significant issues with dumping which has become expensive. They are looking to purchase security cameras to cover the lots. They have enough money but need to change the rules on what is an allowed expense. Councilor Figy thanked her for the update.

8. Upon motion of Councilor Adams, it was VOTED: to SUBMIT an order amending Chapter 16-Streets and Sidewalks by adding Article VI: Complete Streets sections with a POSITIVE RECOMMENDATION.

Prior to the vote, Councilor Adams stated that he can appreciate both sides of the arguments on this. He believes that the City is already following many of the Complete Streets requirements. He spoke to contractors doing the work by St. Mary's Church and they said it's mandatory for new construction to be handicap accessible. He has heard that surrounding Mayors who have adopted Complete Streets, have spoken in favor of the program. Councilor Burns echoed Councilor Adams and added that our City Engineer and Mayor are also in favor of this. Councilor Figy stated that he stands by his 2016 stance, and believes this newer version is easier to read and understand. He believes the local opt-out provision allows for local control. He would not move forward with a rubber stamp mandate for every project. The clause that gives the Mayor the ability to opt out, protects the citizens. The City Engineer has explained that the process is already being implemented with new projects within the City, it only makes sense to collect revenue. He read letters that had been submitted via email from Travis Brenner and Jack Kurty (Appendix C).

9. Upon motion of Councilor Adams, it was VOTED: to SUBMIT an Ordinance amendment as recommended by the Traffic Commission relative to No Parking on one side of Pearl Street with a POSITIVE RECOMMENDATION.

Prior to the vote, Councilor Figy informed the Committee that the Traffic Commission has met and made the recommendation to limit parking to one side to allow for safe travel due to how narrow the street is. The neighborhood was canvassed before the decision was made and the Ward 3 Councilor is in support of this.

10. Upon motion of Councilor Adams, it was

VOTED: to SUBMIT an Ordinance amendment as recommended by the Traffic Commission relative to No Parking on one side of Linden Avenue with a POSITIVE RECOMMENDATION.

Prior to the vote, Councilor Figy informed the Committee this is in Ward 2. Linden Avenue is similar to Pearl Street, it doesn't have the width for parking on both sides. The neighborhood was canvassed before the decision was made.

Upon motion of Councilor Adams, it was VOTED: to SUBMIT an Ordinance amending Chapter 2, Section 2-5-Wards and Section 2-6-Precincts by deleting the sections in their entirety and inserting in place thereof the amended Wards and Precincts as a result of the redistricting which became effective December 31, 2021 with a POSITIVE RECOMMENDATION.

Prior to the vote, City Clerk Karen Fanion informed the committee that the Ordinance gives the word description of the map that was accepted in October of 2021, and went into effect December 31, 2021. Councilor Figy asked if copies of the map could be given to all Councilors. Mrs. Fanion confirmed and stated the map would be available for anyone to view in the City Clerk's Office.

Dear Mr. Figy,

I see that Mayor McCabe has requested Westfield's City Council to add Complete Streets to our city's ordinances. I write to you today in support of Complete Streets. I ask that you support Complete Streets, too, and Mayor McCabe's effort to secure the funding needed to move Westfield forward.

My letter will include Parts A and B. Part A offers my rationale for supporting Complete Streets as a way toward where we want to be heading as a community; in short, toward a respectful, inclusive approach as we develop, together, an improved quality of life in Westfield. Part B endorses Complete Streets because it will take us away from the horrific, real-world consequences that have been experienced by my family and far too many others in Westfield as a result of road-related deaths. As I am sure you know, my father was killed on Western Avenue – hit by a pick-up truck while riding his bike by Stanley Park. Maybe you knew him; he did much for Westfield and was well known in the area. I have attached the last photo we have of him.

An overarching framework is needed to guide the planning and financing of road works in Westfield. Complete Streets will provide such a framework and enable Westfield to qualify for essential state funding. I am confident you will conclude, as I do, that the Mayor's request for Complete Streets needs your endorsement.

Part A: Toward where we want to be heading

Councilor Figy, I have no doubt that you are in support of the following objectives taken from the MassDOT website. These objectives are in line with developments that have already occurred in Westfield and with what we will want to continue to do going forward: "a Complete Street is one that provides safe and accessible options for all travel modes – walking, biking, transit and vehicles – for people of all ages and abilities. Designing streets with these principles contributes toward the safety, health, economic viability and quality of life in a community by improving the pedestrian and vehicular environments. Providing safer, more accessible and comfortable means of travel between home, school, work, recreation and retail destinations helps promote more livable communities."

Agreeing to an approach in the planning and development of Westfield's streets which features the positive values mentioned above will qualify Westfield for much-needed state funding. Many other cities and towns have already adopted Complete Streets and report good results. Quite simply, we will be getting paid to do the right thing. I ask you to support Mayor McCabe's proposal regarding Complete Streets -- it an opportunity too good to pass up.

Part B: Away from the horrific, real-world consequences

I have attached to this email an article entitled, "Ghost bike shows dangers that still exist in Westfield for cyclists." As you consider Complete Streets, I feel compelled to tell you just how devastating a traffic fatality was to our family when my father, John Kurty, was hit and killed. It is my wish that

not one more family experience such great suffering, such distress, caused by so painful a loss – a tragedy that was both grievous and avoidable.

When there is a crash between a motor vehicle and a pedestrian, cyclist, or wheelchair traveler, consequences can be fatal for one of the two parties while the other might receive not even a bump or scratch. With such little margin for error, we must always be mindful and representative of the needs of all city residents, no matter what their mode of transportation, their age, their physical abilities, or reason for travel. Our roadways are a common resource – surely, we want to prioritize future developments with a thoughtful plan that provides a safe experience for all of our citizens.

When my father was killed, my life was changed instantly, monumentally and permanently. Some might call his untimely death an "accident," a term that seems much too easy going when one considers the reality that befalls all surviving family members. If you went to the site of the crash today, close to the WSU Woodward Athletic Center, you might ask, "How could a death have happened here? This road is great – bike lane, turning lane, cautionary signage, a pedestrian crosswalk, etc." I support all the Complete Street improvements that have been done here but the fact is, this stretch of road has only been improved since my father died here. In my mind, as strong and as painful as ever, is the indelible image of blood on the road, personal belongings scattered about, and a shattered bike that he had ridden down the driveway at our home just moments before. There are other streets in Westfield that need this kind of improvement.

Lessons Learned

Recognizing the many and varied demands put upon one of our most important resources -- our roads -- should lead us to seek state money by adopting Complete Streets. These funds, and a desire to provide for the safety of all of our residents, will enable us to get ahead of the curve on a topic – highway safety -- that has had tragic consequences for too many Westfield residents, their families and friends, neighbors and colleagues. Dangerous environments were reported on in the article I have attached, and continuing Westfield deaths and news stories make it clear that problems continue.

I urge you and all of your colleagues on City Council to support Complete Streets. I will be so proud to see you all taking the lead in making Westfield a community where the needs of all people -- linked by our system of roads -- can be heard, honored and protected.
