REMOTE MEETING MINUTES

Conservation Commission members in attendance: Chairman David Doe (DD), Vice Chairman James Murphy (JM), Thomas Sharp (TS), Carl Grobe (CG), Alex Fagnand (AF), Cliff Laraway (CL) and Robert Florek (RF). Also in attendance: Meredith Borenstein, Conservation Coordinator and Colleen Fegan-Nunez, Administrative Assistant.

Commissioner Doe reads: *Pursuant to Governor Baker's March 12, 2020 Order Suspending Certain Provisions of the Open Meeting Law, G.L. c. 30A, §20, and the Governor's March 15, 2020 Order imposing strict limitation on the number of people that may gather in one place, this meeting of the City of Westfield Conservation Commission will be conducted via remote participation. No in-person attendance of members of the public will be permitted, but every effort will be made to ensure that the public can adequately access the proceedings in real time, via technological means. 1. CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL

Chairman Doe calls the meeting to order at 6:30 pm. He takes attendance. All Commission members are in attendance.

2. OPEN PARTICIPATION

Chairman Doe asks if there is anything that could not make the agenda. There is none.

3. PUBLIC HEARINGS

A. Westfield River Floodway- City of Westfield-DEP File #333-0792

Clearing vegetation in the Westfield River Floodway

Mr. Robert Levesque and Mr. Ryan Nelson of R. Levesque and Associates Inc. are present representing.

The Commission discusses what the applicant will need to move forward.

- B. 231 East Main Street (28R-10) and 0 South Meadow Road (28R-6)-Brixmor SPE, LLC
c/o Reuben Twersky-DEP File #333-796
Construction of a retail store (Aldi's Market) and associated site improvements within the
100-year Floodplain
Mr. Robert Levesque and Mr. Ryan Nelson of R. Levesque and Associates Inc. are
present representing Brixmor SPE, LLC.

Vice Chairman Murphy reads the legal language. The Commission discusses the project
and the location of the compensatory storage. Mr. Levesque explains that it is not for
stormwater storage but that it is for floodwater. The abutters express concern about the
location of the floodwater storage and if the new building will be an impediment to water
flow in the event of a flood. The Commission decides that a site visit is necessary. The
Commission asks that the representative address the DEP comments and the City Bylaw
in writing and research what type of modeling can be done to assess localized flooding.

- C. 163 Union Street (42R-14)- Cargill, Inc.-DEP File #333-797
Stormwater Management Improvements at the Salt Storage Facility within the 100-year
Floodplain.
Mr. Russ Parkman of Ramball is present representing Cargill, Inc.

Chairman Doe reads the legal language. Mr. Parkman presents the project which is for
stormwater management to improve/decrease the salinity of run-off under a consent
decree administered by the Attorney Generals' office. The Commission discusses the
how the applicant would deal with a flood event. The Commission asks Mr. Parkman to
address DEP comments. The Coordinator discusses that there are open OOCs on this
property. The Commission discusses the timeline for finishing the proposed project. The
Commission decides that a site visit is necessary.

A. 51 Deer Path Lane (62R-49)

Clearing in the 100-foot Buffer Zone of an intermittent stream without a permit.

Coordinator Borenstein states that the land owner is working on this Enforcement.

B. 58 Southwick Road (91-17)-Casey Management Corp/Jelly Belly Pool and Spa Soil storage and sedimentation in the Buffer Zone without a permit.

Coordinator Borenstein states that the land owner is asking to install concrete blocks rather than jersey barriers.

Commissioner Sharp motions to accept the concrete blocks as long as they are comparable to jersey barriers and is seconded by Commissioner Grobe. JM-Yes, CG-Yes, RF-Yes, TS-Yes, AF-Yes, CL-Yes

Commissioner Fagnand recuses himself.

C. 115 West Silver Street (34-11)-Baystate Noble Hospital

Grading of gravel parking lot located off Court Street without a permit or erosion controls. Mr. Robert Levesque of R. Levesque and Associates Inc. (RLA) and Mr. Brown of Baystate Noble Hospital are present representing Baystate Noble Hospital.

Mr. Levesque explains some of the problems with the site. The Commission states that jersey barriers and a comprehensive plan are necessary. Mr. Levesque states that RLA will develop a restoration plan to be implemented in the spring of 2021.

Commissioner Grobe motions to install jersey barriers for now and a more comprehensive restoration plan be presented in the spring and is seconded by Commissioner Sharp. JM-Yes, CG-Yes, RF-Yes, TS-Yes, CL-Yes

D. 110 Union Street Full Gospel Church -Question about boulders vs. trees vs. planters

The Commission discusses whether trees or planters would be a good replacement for the required boulders. The property manager expresses concerns about the aesthetics of the boulders. The Commission decides that a site visit is necessary.
