

Most of the prescription drugs abused by teens come from family medicine cabinets and from friends. Teens don't realize that prescription drugs can be deadly. All members of our community can help make a difference by monitoring all pills and medications in your home and disposing of your unused prescriptions properly. Residents can drop off these medications at the Westfield Police Department kiosk 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, no questions asked.

If a resident is unable to use the kiosk please remove medications from their containers and put them in an undesirable substance like coffee grounds or kitty litter mixed with water. Put them in an unmarked bag and throw them in the trash. Do not flush unused medications down the drain unless the label or accompanying information specifically instructs you to do so.

Please contact the Westfield Health Department for any questions regarding how to safely dispose of medications.
